Many thanks to those parents who have returned the Flu vaccination consent form. May we remind parents who have yet to give their consent to the NHS for their child to receive the Flu vaccination to do so as soon as possible.

The Government advise that the flu vaccine won't protect you from COVID-19. But it will help protect you against flu, which is an unpleasant and potentially serious infection that can cause complications leading to hospital admission. Helping to protect against flu is particularly important with COVID-19 in circulation, because people vulnerable to COVID-19 are also at risk of complications from flu.

We would like to remind parents that the recommended age for playing Fortnite is 12 years old due to "frequent scenes of mild violence." In addition to this, in school we have experienced children falling out over the game. During gameplay, children can play against their friends, choosing whether to play co-operatively or against each other and there are increased incidents of children falling out because their friend 'killed' them in the game, which is affecting their and others' ability to learn.
