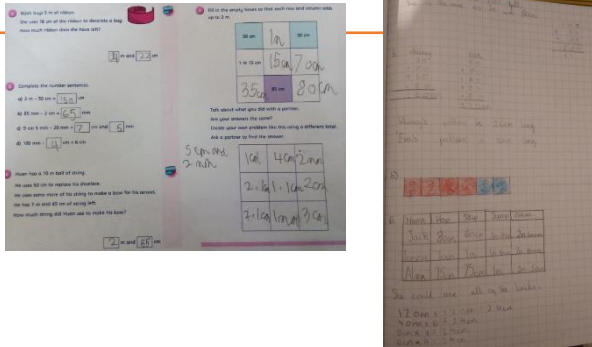


## Maths

## Spring Term in Year 4



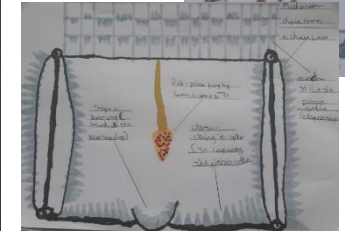
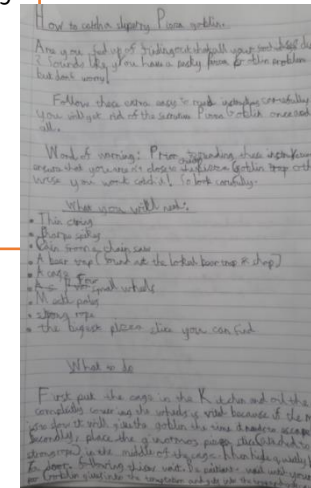
## Science

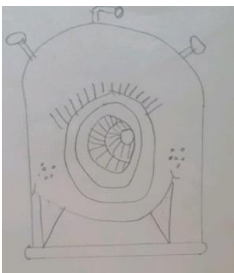
## English

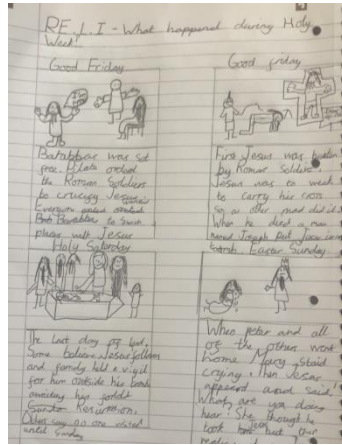
## RE

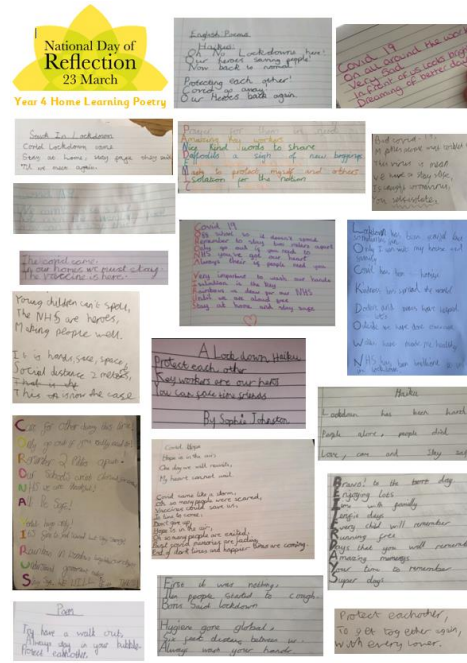
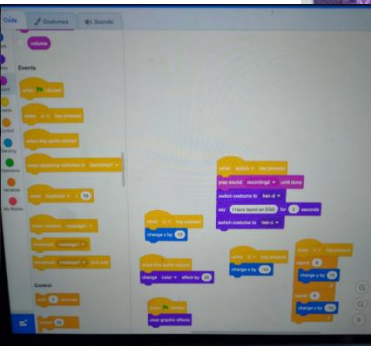
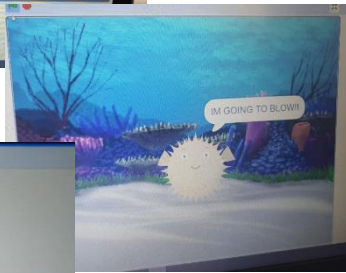
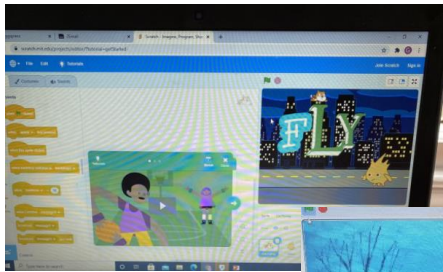
## Computing – Scratch
